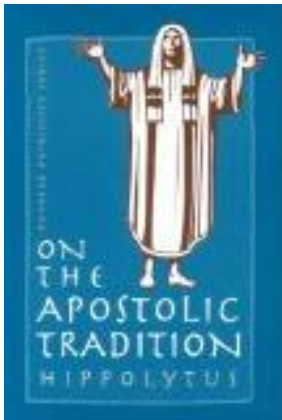


The Epistles of St. Clement of Rome and ST. Ignatius of Antioch

St. Clement and **St. Ignatius** are amongst the APOSTOLIC FATHERS, meaning they have had direct contact with the Apostles.

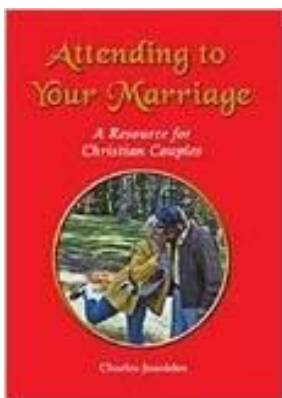
St. Clement wrote this Letter ca. 96AD as the Pope of Rome to the Church in Corinth with the intent to restore ecclesiastical order and reinstate to the Church of Corinth the wrongly deposed Church hierarchy. However, this Letter is full of insights into human character and what it means to live a pious Christian life devoid of jealousy and envy as well as behaving in a headstrong and rash manner.

Later in time, St. Ignatius wrote this Letter that is somewhat similar to St. Clement's. He focuses on Christian life but in a more personal and cordial manner, addressing friends on a personal affair. He also offers a sharp renunciation on some heretical teachings.



The Apostolic Tradition - Hippolytus

The original text is by Presbyter Hippolytus of Rome and dates from around 215 A.D. This version was translated and commented by Alistair Stewart-Sykes, a leading English Scholar on the origins of Liturgical practices. This book offers (a) an insight in the earliest forms of the structure, liturgy, and worship of the primitive, post New Testament; (b) the early establishment of the ecclesiastic structure of bishop, priest, and deacon; (c) the key emphasis and importance of the Eucharist in worship; (d) and the significance of baptism, confirmation, the use of oil in healing, etc.
