


St. John Maximovitch: Mary - The Birthgiver of God.


Drawing from Scripture, the fourth and fifth century Fathers of the Church and from the Liturgy, **Archbishop St. John Maximovitch** puts forth a proper understanding of the Holy Mary Theotokos and why she should be venerated. He traces Her veneration by all people from the Apostolic era to the present and defines Her stature in the Orthodox Church.

Sergious Bulgakov: The Burning Bush



In this book, **Sergius Bulgakov**, a Russian Theologian (1871-1944) refutes the Roman Catholic dogma of the Immaculate Conception and discusses the Orthodox veneration of the Mother of God. The Burning Bush is a consideration of the personal sinlessness of Mary, the truth of which stems from both the Gospels and the liturgical tradition of the church.
