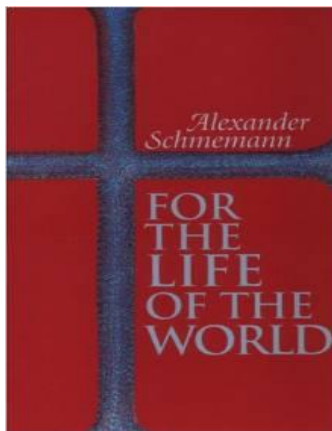


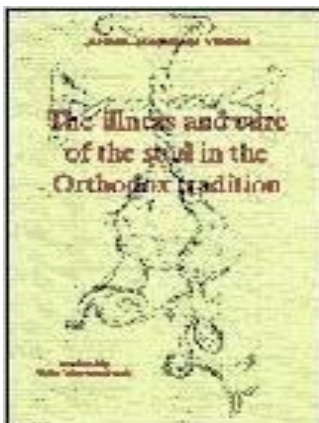
THE COMFORTER

Sergius Bulgakov is a renowned twentieth century Orthodox theologian. His book *The Comforter* is an utterly comprehensive and profound study of the Holy Spirit. It explores all aspects of the Orthodox doctrine of the Holy Spirit, as they are viewed in tradition and Church history. The book traces the development of the doctrine of the Spirit in early Christianity and on the development of the doctrine of procession in the patristic and later Byzantine periods. It also touches on the place of the Holy Spirit in the Trinity and explores Old and New Testament notions of the Spirit of God. It concludes with the mystical revelation of the Holy Spirit.



FOR THE LIFE OF THE WORLD

In *For the Life of the World* **Alexander Schmemmann** suggests an approach to the world and life within it, which stems from the liturgical experience of the Orthodox Church. He understands issues such as secularism and Christian culture from the perspective of the unbroken experience of the Church, as revealed and communicated in her worship, in her liturgy - the sacrament of the world, the sacrament of the Kingdom.



THE ILLNESS AND CURE OF THE SOUL IN THE ORTHODOX TRADITION

Metropolitan Hierotheos uses quotations from the Church Fathers and many saints to support his conviction that man's soul suffers illness which distorts his relationship with God, his fellow men and nature. This illness can be cured in the "hospital" of the Church. It is based on a series of lectures at the St. John of Damascus Faculty of Theology, University of Balamand, in Koura, Lebanon.
